

THIRTY YEARS FOR THE MARTINS

Congratulations to Cambridgeshire UCCC Teversham Motors and the Martin family who celebrate 30 years in business this month.

The premises of Teversham Motors have been connected with transport for some 60 years, firstly with motorcycles and then – from the Second World War onwards – with cars. Today it is run by father and son Brian and Simon Martin, and employs three mechanics carrying out MOTs, servicing and repairs. There is also a petrol forecourt.

Teversham village lies to the east of Cambridge and, in addition to the garage, boasts a Post Office (which is next door) and a pub. Business is brisk and last year Teversham Motors dealt with 1,300 customers, among them two companies which have been customers of Brian from the beginning – civil engineers Borley Brothers and precision engineers Listers, who built the Lister-Jaguar racing cars.

The Martin family were due to celebrate their 30th anniversary with an open day on May 2. Invitations have been sent out to all regular customers as well as the local primary school.

'We're donating some computer software to the school and we expect to give pupils a guided tour of the premises so they can get to understand more about cars,' said 28-year-old Simon, who joined his father in the business two years ago.
